

Annals of Science Best Paper Prize Winners

The *Annals of Science* best paper prize is offered to the author of an original, unpublished essay in the history of science or technology, which is not under consideration for publication elsewhere. The prize, which is supported by Taylor & Francis, is intended for those who are currently doctoral students, or have been awarded their doctorate within the past four years.

The winning essays are published in the Journal, and the author is awarded US\$500 and a 1 year free subscription to *Annals of Science*; the leading scholarly Journal in the field!

Previously awarded bi-annually, from 2009 onwards the prize will be offered on an annual basis.
